"Miracle" Play

EMLYN WILLIAMS newest play, "The Wind of Heaven." and fumbling is a sombre moral homily. The characters portrayed by Brisbane Players in Repertory Theatre the Albert Hall last night seemed like poseurs and the idiomatic lines so much verbal shorthand.

There could, of course, be a certain amount of misunderstanding about this, and portrayed by professional players the whole thing might assume some theatrical value.

Mr. Williams has used a circus proprietor to stumble across a "new Messiah" in a remote Welsh village and bring regeneration to the world through a vast revival in religion.

Regarded purely as amateur performances, the best of the night were those by Gerry Greet, Evan Howell, and Betty Ross.—TE PANA.
